

General Search



If the person is living with a Native American group the census will show a special form having 15 lines numbered from 1 to 15, at the top of the page recording the usual federal census information. If the person is found in this section on line #1, drop to the lower half of the page, to line 1. There you will find the person's Indian name, his tribe, his quantum of Indian blood, his father's tribe and quantum and his mother's tribe and quantum of Indian blood.

This information is acceptable to the US Government for establishing Native
American blood, for their purposes and also for employment purposes. It is not acceptable evidence to the tribes for citizenship

Check the Family History LibraryCatalog (FHLC) for the records that have been filmed for that particular tribe.

Sanitary Rolls

Census Records (tribal census, these will not be similar to Federal census, they were taken by the agent to the tribe and he asked whatever questions he wanted.)

The "Five Civilized Tribes"

The Five Civilized Tribes was a loose confederation, formed in 1859, of North American Indians in what was then INDIAN TERRITORY (in present-day Oklahoma). The group comprised the Iroquoian-speaking CHEROKEE and the Muskogean-speaking CHICKASAW, CHOCTAW, CREEK, and SEMINOLE.

If they were relocated to Oklahoma, check the Dawes Rolls:

a Obtain the Roll Number for the person

- 1. Look in the book <u>Final Roll of the Dawes Index</u> (call# 970.1 Un3c Book 1) for the persons name. You must look in all sections: "Cherokee by Blood", "Minor Cherokee by Blood", "Delaware Cherokee", "Intermarried White", "Cherokee Freedmen", and "Minor Cherokee Freedmen".
- 2. When you find the name, note the section you found it in and the roll number listed to the right of the name.

- 1. Book 1 of the Index for all tribes is on film #962366
- 2. Book 2 of the Index is on film #830228 (Choctaw & Chickasaw), film #830229 (Cherokee), film #830230 (Seminole & Creek)
- 3. If the name was found under other than "Cherokee by Blood" use the film instead of the Book 2. Book 2 in the printed form is incomplete.

b Obtain the Census Card number



- 1. Now look in book 2 of the Index (call# 970.1 Un3c Book 2) for the Roll #. Make sure you are in the same section you used in Book 1 ("Cherokee by Blood", "Minor Cherokee by Blood", "Delaware Cherokee", "Intermarries White", "Cherokee Freedmen", and "Minor Cherokee Freedmen") This will give you: Name, Age, Sex, Quantum of Indian Blood and Census Card #.
- 2. NOTE THE CENSUS CARD #
- © Obtain the Film
 - 1. Now look in the book, <u>Dawes Film Number</u>, <u>Civilized Tribes</u> (call# 970.3 A3). Locate the film # corresponding to the Census Card Number under the tribe and section heading where the name was found. Film #
 - 2. Pull the microfilm and review the information.
- d For rejected claimants Check CD #158 "Dawes Final Rolls" on CD computers 1, 2, & 4.
 - 1. Get Case File # and send to the National Archives to get file.

For Cherokees who stayed in North Carolina, read the Guion Miller Rolls.

The Guion Miller Rolls pertain to the Eastern Band of Cherokee. These are packages of information relating to the Eastern Cherokee enrollment records 1908 to 1910. They are found in the Family History Library Catalog (FHLC) under:

August 29, 1906-May 26, 1909 Transcription taken from the Guion Miller Reports

- CHEROKEE BY BLOOD (call# 970.3 C424j, Volumes 1-9) by Jerry Jordan (This is the easiest way, but it is incomplete. When completed this collection will have 22 volumes.)
 - 1. Look in the back of each volume for the persons name. If the name is found, note the Application #.
 - 2. Go to the front part of the same volume and find the information under the Application #.

NOTE: Only the first 9 volumes of the 22 actual volumes are in print.

(b) COURT OF CLAIMS EASTERN CHEROKEE APPLICATIONS

- 1. Search the Applications Index on Film #830434 (A-Z Index) for the person's name. Note the application number(s) of the records that pertain to the person. This is only for people who applied, and only names of people applying are indexed.
- 2. Review the information on the appropriate film below for the application number:

•Read the 1890 tribal census (set up by Districts, not complete).

Instructions of where to find it:

Choose Place Search

Type Oklahoma

Click on Oklahoma

Arrow down to Native American

Click on Native American

•Find Cherokee 1890 census – there will be several films, on different Districts – check all.

•Read "Exploring Your Cherokee Ancestry" for more rolls that might help.

Click on James Manfred Carselowey

- Check each Carselowey book. There are 7 volumes and they are listed separately
- •Check the Don Shadburn books (5 volumes) found in the Author Title section of the card catalog. Same procedure as above.
- Check Emmet Starr's "Old Cherokee Families" and 2 volumes of NOTES.
- •Check "Old Cherokee Families" 970.3 C424 se and notes 970.3 C424seb
- See attached Check List

The rule of thumb for Native American records is to search everywhere and write everything down.
