

Family History Research in a State Archives

Although FamilySearch, ancestry.com and others have digitized many government records, their scope is quite narrow. This becomes evident the farther back you go on your family line.

Your state's State Archives is a place where you can connect to the records that may break down that proverbial brick research wall.

The Greek root of the word history is "inquiry," a systematic investigation into a subject by asking questions, finding clues and providing thoughtful and well-reasoned analysis and interpretation. When we do family history, we should have a continual dialogue with our sources.
