When you visit us, you have access to over 150 trained missionaries and volunteers who can make your search quicker and more productive. The 81,000 rolls of microfilm and 52,000 microfiche, 40,000 books, 700 commercial CD's packed with information, and 130 computers with access to thousands of websites (all completely free) will greatly assist you in finding those individuals who have been waiting so long to be found.

Be sure to check out our class schedules each month on our website (and in this newsletter) and take advantage of the 80+ classes offered each month to learn from the experts how to use the new programs and how to best do your research. Many Family History Centers charge for these services to cover overhead. All of our classes are free! They are available 6 days a week and are offered both day and evenings to best accommodate your individual schedules. Come check them out!

Books that Endure

We have every type of genealogical resource book imaginable! Over 40,000 of them. The books are organized by locality and include: parish church records, maps, atlases, gazetteers, military records, vital records (birth, marriage, death), cemetery records, probate and land records, census and tax records, local histories and in addition, we have several thousand family histories and biographies. Come in and look for your family's history! It may be here! We also have books on CD's (many family histories) and books on-line accessed through our on-line catalog. There are even "How To" books that will teach you how to do research in specific localities. The internet is nice, but it is also nice to hold a book!

Microfilms, Microfiche, ScanPro

The Mesa Family History Center has approximately 81,000 rolls of microfilm and more than 52,000 microfiche. These rolls of microfilm as well as the sheets of microfiche contain Census, birth and death records, marriage, LDS records, passenger lists, cemetery records, military involvement, church records, public records from all many different countries and much much more. There are 14 standard microfilm readers and 3 standard microfiche readers.

Our newest tools for microfilms are the **ScanPro digital scanners**. These machines are ideal for viewing information found on microfilm and also microfiche. Start with traditional readers and then use a ScanPro to edit them for reviewing, printing, and even storage on a USB Drive. It edits size, color, cropping, and lighting and many other helpful tools and options. The best part of these machines is that they are digital and electronic, making them very easy to use and operate. Plus, we have missionaries at the center that specialize in these machines and can assist any patron that might need some extra help.

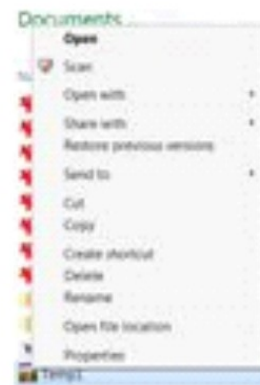
Right Clicking :

Is one of the easiest ways to get a drop down list. This will work in almost any program like PAF, Ancestral Quest, RootsMagic or Legacy. The drop down list will allow you to print, edit or perform other special functions. The drop down list (example shown on right) will also work on most pages, giving you the option to print as well.

Right clicking on or in different objects or pages will give different drop down lists of options available. No problem has been found when performing a right click.

What is FamilySearch.org

FamilySearch.org is a free website maintained by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Its use is available to everyone at no charge or obligation and there are no advertising links on the site. The site is available to all individuals doing genealogical or family history research. FamilySearch will be reviewed in this newsletter each month to encourage users to avail themselves of the many free data bases to research and other important research information present on this site.

Research Wiki in FamilySearch.org

In addition to free access to indexed databases and copies of microfilmed records, the research Wiki provides thousands of articles on a variety of topics affecting family history research. Weekly classes are provided at the Mesa Family History Center to teach individuals how to use and contribute to the Research Wiki. The contributions may be as simple as editing corrections to articles or the submission of articles to the Wiki – thus adding information which may be useful to other researchers. A researcher must have an account to make contributions, to the Wiki. As of November 15, 2011, there were over 64,000 such articles available to researchers.

Research Courses in FamilySearch.org

FamilySearch.org also provides instructions to assist in family history research. Written records are also interpreted and assistance is given in the deciphering of foreign documents. The translation of foreign words to English is also provided in courses designed to assist the researcher.

New additions to the FamilySearch.org databases

During the period, October 15, 2011 thru November 14, 2011, there were over 111 databases added to the collection of existing databases of original records available to be researched on line. Twenty seven were indexed 93,520,746 records (searchable by a person's name) and eighty four of the databases were not indexed. The databases are from information sources and from countries worldwide (e.g. several of the continents, the Caribbean and Pacific Islands).
